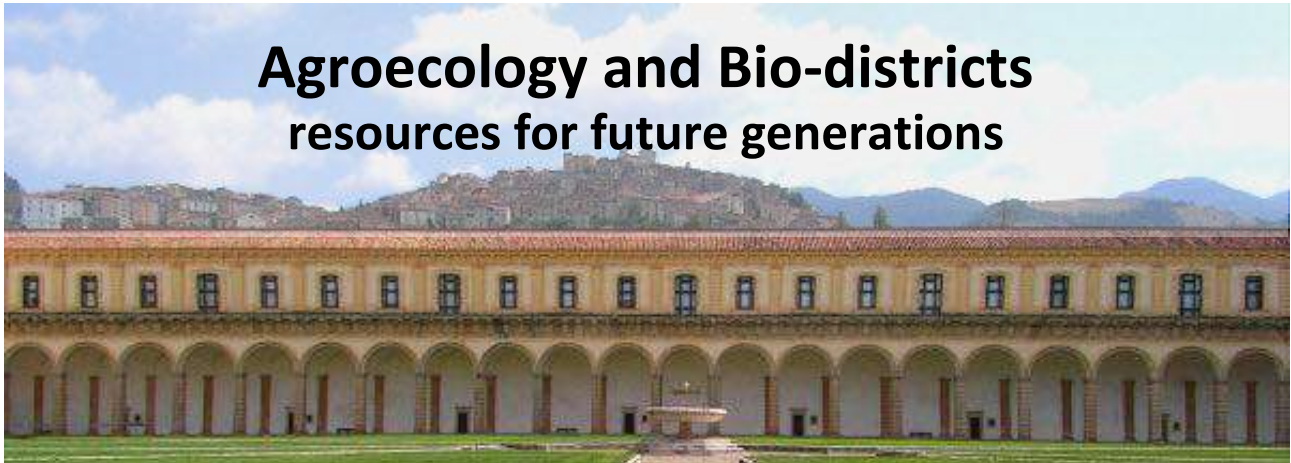

The initiative is organized one year after the presentation of the “**Padula Charter**” with the aim to promote the role of agroecology:

- to develop organic agriculture at territorial level, through the **growing of Bio-districts**
- to reach **100% of organic production in the Parks by 2030**.

We advocate to strengthen and spread the knowledge and good farming practices which can combat climate changes, reduce the loss of natural biodiversity and the soil's consumption.

The meeting intends to value the innovative contribution of Agroecology to be endorsed within the CAP's reform and the new European programming.

The purpose is to develop a network of support to the Padula Charter and the **European Charter of Agroecology in Protected Areas**, to be encouraged thanks to new alliances and political and technical contributions.

Therefore the consolidation of the partnership between all social subjects available to promote Agroecology, while at the same time seeking to strengthen relations with Institutions, research bodies and all the actors involved in these issues.
